WHAT IS PUBLIC SCOPING?

Public scoping is a vital process where governmental agencies exchange information with the public to enable each to evaluate, fully appreciate and possibly improve policies, procedures or regulations. The Governor issued Administrative Order No. 266 in August 2013, and this directive encourages public participation in the development of state agency regulations. It allows us to talk to the public, in scoping meetings like this one, prior to advancing regulations and enables us to gather valuable information to assist in crafting such regulations and developing policies for managing oil and gas activities on state land.
