

**SUPPLEMENTAL NOTICE FOR CALL FOR COMMENTS ON  
ALASKA COASTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM CONSISTENCY (ACMP)  
REVIEW FOR THE IVAN RIVER GAS STORAGE LEASE APPLICATION**

The Alaska Department of Natural Resources (ADNR), Division of Oil and Gas (DO&G) hereby gives supplemental notice under 11 AAC 110.500(d) of receipt of a gas storage lease application under AS 38.05.180(u). Notice is also given under AS 46.40.096(c) that this application is within the Matanuska-Susitna (Mat-Su) Borough Coastal Management District.

Union Oil Company of California (UNOCAL) proposes to store natural gas in the Beluga 71-3 Gas Sand below the surface of the ground within the Ivan River Unit utilizing an existing gas well, Ivan River 44-36, and support facilities located approximately 27 miles west of Point MacKenzie, Alaska. The storage area and partially depleted gas pool contains approximately 865 acres owned by the State of Alaska. All of the lands within the proposed storage area are subject to existing oil and gas leases within the Ivan River Unit, owned and operated by UNOCAL. The storage area is located in portions of the following lands:

T. 13 N., R. 8 W., Seward Meridian, Section 6,  
T. 13 N., R. 9 W., Seward Meridian, Section 1,  
T. 14 N., R. 8 W., Seward Meridian, Section 31,  
T. 14 N., R. 9 W., Seward Meridian, Section 36.

On June 16, 2011, the Division of Coastal and Ocean Management concurred with the consistency certification submitted by Union Oil Company of California for the modification to existing Ivan River Unit (IRU) Plan of Operations Permit LOCI 08-007, dated October 23, 2008. Modification of Permit LOCI 08-007 involves the conversion of the IRU 44-36 well to a gas storage well, installation of compression equipment, and the upgrade of production facilities to support the gas storage facility on the Ivan River Pad.

The public is invited to comment on the proposed gas storage lease application's consistency with enforceable policies of the program. Comment regarding consistency with any Mat-Su Borough District Plan enforceable policies or the state standards set out in 11 AAC 112 must be in writing and identify the relevant ACMP enforceable policy and explain how the project is consistent or not consistent with that policy. Following this comment period, DO&G will issue a consistency determination. DO&G will send a copy of the consistency determination to any person who provides written comment.
