Trans Alaska Pipeline System
Fuel Gas Line Gate Valves 2, 3, 4 and 6 Replacement (F838)

Dear Mr. Walsh:

Alyeska Pipeline Service, on behalf of the TAPS Lessees, hereby applies to modify the land description of the referenced Lease in order to accommodate the subject work at three of the referenced valves (nos. 2, 3 and 6). At Valve 4, we are applying for peripheral land use permission instead to support the work which will relocate the valve completely within the existing TAPS right-of-way boundaries. This package follows the several discussions at recent Monthly Lands and Permits Meetings about multi-valve project which is similar to FGL valve replacements conducted in 2012 under Alyeska project F802. The attached project schedule shows the new piping work beginning on state land May 25th; the schedule omits MGV 2 because that work is planned in 2017.

Per the direction from your staff, we enclose a drawing set for each site; four of the sheets are the typical views of the work (enclosed). A master narrative is included with the drawing sets. The intent is to allow the Department approvals to be processed individually. Enclosed also is check no. 139 in the amount of \$400.00 to cover the application fees for three right-of-way modifications and one land use permit. The Final Design (Issued for Construction) binder is being submitted under separate cover to request your determination of need for a Notice to Proceed pursuant to Stipulation 1.7.1 of the referenced right-of-way in accordance with SPCO letter no. 12-086-AS dated March 13, 2012.

Applications are being submitted concurrently to the Alaska Departments of Environmental Conservation and Transportation and Public Facilities. Upon completion of construction, we will submit an as-built survey of the structure for the purpose of describing the permanent right-of-way addition.

And, this letter serves to request, pursuant to Stipulation 2.9.1 of the TAPS right-of-way lease, that Alyeska may conduct certain short-term, non-intrusive activities related to the work, such as dewatering and water quality monitoring, outside of the permanent and amended right-of-way limits. Such access would occur only if needed and be via foot, passenger vehicles and small, rubber-tired or tracked equipment and include the placement of hoses, and other small, portable equipment.
